# **FAQs of the Month**

#### I keep getting emails about the 125% rule. Should I be concerned?

- The 125% rule applies to students receiving in-state tuition. A student may not receive in-state tuition for more than 125% of the credits required for their declared degree. After that, a surcharge is applied.
- Three different types of emails are sent from the Registrar's Office regarding this rule.
- Advisory emails provide information about the 125% rule. You do not need to be concerned about these. But, they are a good reminder to <u>make sure that your official degree plan is declared as soon as possible,</u> <u>including any dual degrees and/or minors</u>.
- Warning emails are sent when a student has attempted 100% of the credit hours for their degree. <u>Credit</u> <u>threshold is based on declared degree plan at the time of the first warning email</u>. After that, adding additional minors will NOT allow more credits.
  - AOE students receive warning emails when they hit 127 credits.
  - But, if you have declared minors and/or second degrees (NOT double majors), you get additional allowed credits. Also, credits earned in high school do NOT count against your limit.
  - Transfer credits earned at public Virginia colleges after high school DO count towards the 125% limit.
  - Review your DARS and/or check with your advisor to determine a plan to finish before hitting 125%.
- The **tuition surcharge email** is sent when a student has exceeded 125% of allowed credits and will receive a surcharge. Definitely talk to the Registrar's Office if you receive this email!
- Check out the 125% rule resources/FAQs posted by the Registrar's Office on their in-state status website.

# I want to take courses at a different college/university this summer. What should I do?

- Follow the COE instructions/requirements for <u>Transferrable Credits from other Universities</u>.
- For a VCCS course, use the <u>VCCS Guide</u> to determine the equivalent course. Non-VCCS courses must be pre-approved using COE's <u>Authorization to Take Courses Elsewhere</u> form.
- If the transfer course is a prerequisite for a FA 2023 AOE course, request a <u>force-add</u> once you have your final grade (must be a C or higher).

#### Where can I get an unofficial copy of my transcript?

- In Hokie Spa, open your unofficial transcript in the "Transcripts & Certifications" menu.
- Select "print" and then "save to PDF".
