- Get your resume ready now. Many teams recruit new members in August/September. You should be ready to fill out applications & submit your resume.
- Keep an eye on your email. In early fall we frequently forward out information about design team applications and events.

- Read about design teams. Visit teams at the Ware lab and/or AEDL. Reach out to team leaders by email.
