FAQs of the Month

I'm new to AOE. What is a typical credit load and how much time should I be spending on my courses?

- 15-17 credits per semester is typical, but what works for individual students will vary. You should be doing a minimum of two hours of work outside of class for every credit hour of lecture that you attend (i.e. 15 credits equals ~45 hours of work per week). Careful time management is essential!
- When planning your course load, take into account the time you need to reserve for other commitments (e.g. job, student organization, design team).
- Assess how things are going prior to the drop deadline. If your schedule feels like more than you can manage, talk to your academic advisor to see if you can drop something.

How can I become involved in engineering-related extracurricular activities?

• Interested in engineering design teams?

- Get your resume ready now. Many teams recruit new members in August/September. You should be ready to fill out applications & submit your resume. In early fall we frequently forward out emails about design team applications and events.
- Visit engineering design teams at GobblerFest and talk to current members.
- Read about design teams. Visit teams at the Ware lab and/or AEDL. Reach out to team leaders by email.

• Interested in engineering student organizations?

- Join the VT chapter of the professional society for aerospace engineers (<u>AIAA</u>) and/or ocean engineering (<u>SNAME</u>). Start attending meetings & events.
- Join <u>AOE-related organizations</u> and/or other engineering organizations (search <u>GobblerConnect</u>). Look for ways that you can actively participate and maybe eventually take on a leadership role.
