- Get a paid or volunteer job. Non-engineering work is still a great way to gain experience & soft skills that will benefit you in future engineering jobs.
- See if you can volunteer in a research lab.
- Learn a new technical skill or coding language.
- Contact STEM programs that you may have participated in as a K-12 student (e.g. camps, robotics/rocketry teams) and see if you could come back to assist as a volunteer this summer.
- Job shadow engineers working in industry
- Work on an independent engineering project or continue work for a design team/organization.

## **FAQs of the Month**

# I am enrolled in one summer course at VT but no longer want to take it. How do I drop the course?

• Students are not able to drop their final credits for a term through Hokie Spa. To drop all of your summer credits, use the <u>withdrawal/resignation form</u>.

# I'm graduating this month! How do I get a copy of my transcript that shows my degree conferral?

- Order an official transcript through National Student Clearinghouse (more information here).
- If you are graduating in May 2025 and are placing the transcript order before 5/20/2025, select "hold for degree" to have your transcript processed after your degree has been conferred. If you are placing the order after 5/20/2025, first double-check Hokie Spa to make sure that your degree has been awarded.
- A "hold for grades" option is also available.

#### What can I do this summer to make the start of the Fall 2025 Semester easier?

- Create/update a long-term degree plan for yourself. If you have questions about your long-term plan or Fall 2025 courses, schedule a summer appointment (virtual available) with your advisor through Navigate.
- <u>Apply for your degree</u> if you still need to. Then, run a DARS report and check with your advisor if you have questions about your progress towards degree requirements.
- Update your resume & LinkedIn profile. Get <u>resume tips</u> and <u>career advising</u> from the VT career office.
- Make a "game plan" for the start of the fall semester. Here are some opportunities to consider:
  - AOE Alumni Mentoring Network: This program is advertised in August and AOE students are matched with mentors in September.
  - <u>Study Abroad</u>: If you are interested in studying in Hamburg, Germany in SP 2025, meet with <u>Global</u>
    <u>Education</u> and your academic advisor this summer. Study abroad applications are due mid-September.
  - Many design teams and organizations start advertising for new members in August/September.
    Research teams/organizations you are interested in getting involved with. Find more information here:

  - Start thinking now about doing research next year. Get on listservs for the <u>Hume Center</u> & <u>Space@VT</u>.
    Communicate with <u>AOE faculty</u> about ways that you can get involved with their research.
  - <u>SEC Engineering Expo</u>: This career fair will take place Sept. 9-11. Have your resume updated and start considering companies you will want to connect with.
