- 3. The drop deadline is Feb. 28th & I'm thinking about dropping a course. What should I consider?
 - Understand prerequisites and any impacts on future course scheduling. You may need summer courses and/or take additional time to graduate.
 - Know where in your academic plan you will put the course if you drop it this semester.
 - If you are struggling in a course, think about what you have tried so far. It may make sense to speak to your instructor or seek tutoring before dropping it.
 - Keep in mind that if you choose not to drop a course, you may be able to use a course withdrawal (W) later if needed.
 - Check with the <u>Office of University Scholarships &</u> <u>Financial Aid</u> for questions regarding financial implications of dropping a course.
